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## Recruitment of scholarship students

This scholarship is a grant. This money can be used to go to school or university. Depending on the situation, this money may or may not need to be paid back later.

### (1) Scholarship Loan System (※This is a scholarship that needs to be paid back.)

- ▼Eligibility: Persons who are scheduled to attend an applicable school (see chart below) during the 2025 fiscal year and for whom ① and ② below apply.
  - ① Persons who are a dependent of a citizen living in Utsunomiya City, and for whom it is difficult to attend school due to economic reasons.
  - ② Persons who can choose a joint guarantor who pays taxes properly.
- ※A joint guarantor is a person who can pay back the scholarship grant if the applicant is unable to.
- ▼Grant amount: 20,000 yen or less per month for high schools, etc., 50,000 yen per month for universities, etc.
- ▼Recruitment quota: Around 150 people
- ▼Selection method: Examination of application documents
- ▼Application period: December 2 – January 30 (Must arrive by final date)
- ▼Application documents: Scholarship loan application form and recommendation from school principal

### (2) Payback Exemption Scholarship Loan System (※This is a scholarship that doesn't need to be paid back.)

- ▼Content: Persons who continue to live in Utsunomiya City in the future can receive this scholarship. People who continue to live within the city for 5 consecutive years after graduating don't have to payback the loan.
- ▼Eligibility: Persons who plan to enter a university, etc. (see chart below) in April 2025 or persons who will be in their second and third years of a university, and for whom ① – ③ below apply.
  - ① Persons who are a dependent of a citizen living in Utsunomiya City, and for whom it is difficult to attend school due to economic reasons.
  - ② Persons who can choose a joint guarantor who pays taxes properly.
  - ③ Persons who hope to live in Utsunomiya City after graduating.
- ▼Grant amount: 20,000 yen per month
- ▼Recruitment quota: Around 60 people
- ▼Selection method: The first round of screening is a document examination based on application documents, and the second round is an essay and interview (mid-March).
- ▼Application period: December 2 – February 28 (Must arrive by final date)
- ▼Application documents: Scholarship for education and training fund application form and recommendation from school principal

#### ■Applicable schools

High schools, etc.	High school, specialized vocational high school, vocational school (with a 2-year or longer term of study), or secondary school (later stage)
Universities, etc.	Graduate school, university, junior college, or vocational school (with a 2-year or longer term of specialized study)

#### ■Application method

Please fill in the necessary information on an application form available at the Education Planning Division (City Hall 13<sup>th</sup> floor), any district community center, any branch office, or library (or download from the city website), and bring or send it in to the Education Planning Division at the City Hall (☎ 320-8540).

## Interview

# Yo of China



We asked Yo of China about Harbin City, what he has noticed about Japan, studying Japanese, entering a university, and recommended cuisine of Harbin.

Nihao! (Hello in Chinese)

Yo came to Japan from Harbin City 10 years ago when he was 16 years old

### UCIA: What kind of place is Harbin?

**Yo:** Located in northern China, it gets down to -30°C in January. Due to the influence of Russia, there are magnificent European-style buildings, and the Harbin Ice Festival is also famous, attracting many tourists from overseas.

### UCIA: What did you notice when you came to Japan?

**Yo:** Japanese students participate in sports and club activities to enjoy school life. In China, learning is the main focus, and students have a “vertical” relationship with their teachers, but in Japan, my teachers treated me kindly.

### UCIA: How did you study Japanese?

**Yo:** I couldn’t speak Japanese at all, so at first I learned Japanese for a month in the “Habataki Classroom,” where I made my first friends. Then I entered junior high school, had a Japanese volunteer teacher from UCIA come to school to teach me Japanese, and attended UCIA night and Sunday Japanese classes.

In addition, HANDS of Utsunomiya University dispatched Chinese exchange students to teach me how to study Japanese history and geography. After graduating from junior high school, I was unable to enter the high school of my choice, but I was able to enter a part-time high school. It was fun every day to learn by interacting with a variety of people including senior citizens, people chose not to attend regular school, and people from other countries.

### UCIA: What was important for you to go on to university?

**Yo:** I was able to enter Utsunomiya University’s Faculty of International Studies through the entrance examination for foreign students, but since I was in junior high school I was told that writing ability is important, so I made an effort to focus on “communicative, historiated, and coherent writing.”

### UCIA: Please tell what cuisine of Harbin you recommend.

**Yo:** Gubaolou is Harbin’s traditional dish of thinly sliced pork topped with batter and fried and eaten with sweet and sour sauce. It’s very delicious.
