▼ When you dispose of garbage, please separate it into "recyclable garbage" (shigen gomi) and "regular garbage" (= 4 types of garbage below).

1. Recyclables (9 types)
2. Hazardous garbage
3. Combustible garbage
4. Incombustible garbage
5. Oversize garbage

▼ This month's edition explains about the separation and disposal methods of "recyclable garbage."

Please separate "recyclable garbage" into the following 9 types when disposing of it.

Please refer to the next month's edition which will explain about the separation and disposal methods of "regular garbage" (4 types of 2. – 5. listed above).

Recyclables (Separate into 9 types)


① Newspaper
(Including ads)



⇒ Stack and tie in a crisscross fashion using string.

② Cardboard

(Corrugated cardboard with a wavy cross section)



⇒ Flatten to condense and tie in a crisscross fashion using string.

③ Magazines & Other Paper


(Magazines, books, paper boxes, envelopes, etc.)



⇒ Tie magazines in a crisscross fashion using string. Put other paper in a paper bag or plastic bag.

④ Paper Beverage Cartons

(Paper beverage cartons for milk or juice, etc. that are white inside)



⇒ Rinse out and tie in a crisscross fashion with string or put in a plastic bag.

⑤ Cloth

(Clothing such as shirts, and cloth such as towels, etc.)



⇒ Put in a plastic bag. Do not dispose of on rainy days.

⑥ Glass Bottles & Cans

(Glass bottles and cans for beverages, food, medicine, cosmetics, etc.)



⇒ Remove caps, rinse out, and then put glass bottles and cans together in a plastic bag.

⑦ PET Bottles

(PET bottles with a "PET bottle symbol" for beverages and seasonings)



⇒ Remove caps and labels, rinse out, and then put in a plastic bag without flattening.

⑧ White Styrofoam Trays

(Trays without any color or design used for meat, fish, etc.)



⇒ Remove food waste and then put in a plastic bag.

⑨ Plastic Containers & Packaging

(Plastic containers and packaging no longer needed after removing or consuming the contents of the product)



Items with "プラ" (plastic) symbol



⚠ Caution Items that are difficult to clean are to be disposed of as combustible garbage

⇒ Rinse off dirty items and put in plastic bag.

※Please use a transparent or semi-transparent plastic bag for the plastic bags mentioned above.

Interview

Violetta of Ukraine

We asked Violetta of Donetsk, Ukraine about the city of Donetsk, her favorite cuisine, traditional customs, raising children in Japan, what is important to her, etc.



добрі дні! Dobri dni ("Hello" in Ukrainian)

Violetta came to Japan 22 years ago and is studying Japanese at UCIA.

UCIA: What kind town is Donetsk like?

Violetta: It is a town like Utsunomiya and is convenient with various facilities. Citizens continue to grow roses, so it has become famous as a "rose city."

UCIA: What is your favorite Ukrainian cuisine?

Violetta: I like varenyky. They look like boiled dumplings, but the skin is thick and they contain potatoes, cabbage, meat, strawberries, blueberries, etc. My family cooks about 300 and eats them little by little.

UCIA: What is a traditional custom of Ukraine?

Violetta: As a celebration of Easter, there is a custom of boiling eggs, drawing on the eggs, decorating the dining table with them, and giving them to friends and family. The decorated eggs are called "Pysanka." The Pysanka Museum was also built, where you can experience the rich history and art of pysanka.

UCIA: How is raising children in Japan?

Violetta: When the children were little, they participated in local "Kodomo-kai" rice cake-making events, radio gymnastics, origami, and onigiri workshops. It was especially fun to cook together with other children's mother friends for the summer festivals.

UCIA: Are you teaching your children Ukrainian?

Violetta: I am busy with my job and can't spend time teaching them, so they can't speak Ukrainian, but they can understand a little. They still sing songs in Ukrainian that they used to sing at Christmas parties with friends from Ukraine and Russia.

UCIA: What is important to you?

Violetta: The war continues in Ukraine, but I hope it will stop soon, and the Ukrainian society will become a place where everyone can live in peace in the future. I hope for peace as soon as possible.
